

## **PRELUDE**

### **I. The College Profile**

Post Graduate Government College-46 is a premier institution of higher learning in the city beautiful, Chandigarh. Though it is just over three decades old, it has made rapid strides in academic excellence, both qualitatively and quantitatively. It is an institute where talents are honed, personal achievement and excellence are encouraged, and leadership qualities are nurtured.

The college was established by the government through affiliation with Panjab University as a college for boys and became functional from July 13, 1982. At the outset, it was housed in a building of the Govt. School, Sector 40, Chandigarh and later it was moved to its present spacious and sprawling new 11-acre campus in 1989. The foundation stone of the building was laid by the then Governor, Sh. S.S. Ray and the college morphed into a co-educational institute in the year 1992.

At first, the college offered basic courses in BA (Humanities) and B.Com.. However, over the years it has added new courses and streams and leapt ahead with noticeable achievements. A UGC- sponsored vocational course in Advertising and Sales Promotion was added in 1997 followed by BBA in 1998, and topped with BCA and M. Com. in 1999 and 2000 respectively, adding new dimensions to the college profile. This has ensured for it the title and status of 'Government Co-educational Postgraduate College'.

Evaluated by NAAC for Cycle-II accreditation with Grade 'A' and a CGPA Score of 3.04, in September 2015, this multi-faculty institution aims to provide inclusive education for inculcating human values, professionalism and scientific temper and to establish a community of scholars actively pursuing the acquisition, creation and dissemination of knowledge. At the core of the college's educational philosophy, modern education and cultural heritage are complimentary and help the students' to become better citizens.

### **ADMINISTRATION**

The process of administering a large institution works through clear direction, proper execution of what is required to be done along with a fair play in the exercise of the powers and responsibilities. The college as an institution stands out markedly in this regard.

The college has enrolled 2107 students out of which 574 are girls and 1533 are boys. There are 62 members of the teaching staff out of which 37 are regular and 25 are on contract, all of whom are highly qualified and dedicated. The total number of sanctioned posts of teaching staff is 64 and that of non-teaching is 49. The library staff comprises of 07 members, 02 librarians, 02 restorers and 03 attendants. Ms. Deepshikha is the Dean, Dr. Shashi Wahi is the Vice-Principal and Dr. V. Magesh is the Bursar of the college. Mr. Jagdish Saini is the Superintendent of the college.

### **COURSES OFFERED**

In its untiring quest for attaining excellence in education, the college has been working towards achieving its objectives as enshrined in its Vision and Mission. For us, each student is special and has the potential to excel in scores of special ways. The college offers programmes in various disciplines such as Humanities (the students are offered a choice of 21 subjects in general and 06 subjects in Honours course), Commerce, Business Administration and Computer Applications. The college also offers a Post Graduate Course in Commerce thus giving enough intellectual exposure to the students.

### **THE COLLEGE LIBRARY**

#### **Chief Librarian: Ms. Mukesh Kumari**

The college library supports the educational mission of the college with an unrelenting commitment to excellence. It acts as a locus of intellectual activity supporting the teaching, research and learning needs of the college. The library has been set up on a modernized platform. It caters to the intellectual as well as the general reading needs of its readers in an ideal and reader-friendly environment with the provision of an open access system. The library upgraded its **Libsys** software with the latest version during the session 2017-18. Approximately, 250 readers visit the spacious, independent library block (926.97 sq. meter area) every day.

**Library Collection:** The library continues to evolve, grow and adapt to the changing needs of its users with a special focus on supplying individualized assistance on a one-to-one basis to a diverse clientele of students and faculty in their quest for the acquisition and integration of knowledge. During the session 2017-18, 2911 books worth Rs.13, 68,842/- were added. The college library boasts of a collection of:

**I. Activities Organized:** Various activities were undertaken to encourage student involvement:

- **Library Orientation Programme:** In order to bring awareness among the college students, the library organized a Two-Day Library Orientation Programme and “Know Your Library” Book Exhibition on Sep. 13-14, 2017. The purpose of the Orientation Programme was to guide and tell the newly admitted students about the facilities provided by the college library. Students were taken around the library to make them aware of the rules of the college library, the arrangement of books and how to use the OPAC software to search a book. The first exhibition was held from Sep. 13-14, 2017 which was inaugurated by Sh. B.L. Sharma, IAS, Education Secretary, Chandigarh Administration. Approximately, 450 students visited the library during this programme. The second exhibition was organized on Feb. 24, 2018. The objective of the exhibitions was to create awareness about college library amongst the students of the college and to encourage them to read.
- **Library-Related Competitions:** Reference Hunting, Essay Writing, Book Jacket Making, Slogan Writing and Collage Making competitions were organized from Jan. 29 to Feb.01, 2018. 44 students participated in these competitions. The winners of the competitions were given away the prizes on Feb. 24, 2018.

**II. Display Board:** Audio-visual section of the library displays current information on various aspects, e.g. information relating to health, career, religion, amazing facts and stress-free examination, etc.

With an objective to improve access, equity and quality in higher education, the RUSA Cell of the college has been actively working to introduce transformative reforms for the betterment of the institution.

### **ACTIVITIES UNDER RUSA**

- A workshop on “Writing Research, Publication and Proposals” on Feb. 07, 2018. It was being conducted by the professors of the Rayat Bahra University, Mohali. 125 undergraduate and postgraduate students participated in the workshop.
- A workshop on “Short-Term Certificate Course in Accounting Technicians (CAT)” on Feb. 15, 2018. The workshop aimed at developing the necessary skills required to apply theoretical knowledge of Accounting to practical situations in different functional areas of Accounting; exposure to environments under which different organizations work and providing an on-job experience of practical aspects of Accounting to the students. 640 undergraduate and postgraduate students participated in it.
- An amount of about 810000/- was spent on infrastructure and equipment during 2017-18. Landscaping, construction of the circular open-air theatre and a pop-up fountain has already been approved and the construction of all these is in the offing. This distinctive feature will add beauty to the college and ours will be the only college in Chandigarh to boast of such an excellent infrastructure.

The number of students who availed financial support (half-fee concession) from the institution is 104. 31 undergraduate students were awarded a scholarship worth Rs 2400/- from the Guru HarKrishan Educational Society and 08 postgraduate students were awarded a scholarship of Rs 3600/- from the same society. Besides this, some poor and needy students were rendered help through funds collected from the staff.
